From Your Interim Priest

Dear friends,

You'll see on the front page a letter from All Saints' new rector, Richard Burden. Richard brings remarkable gifts and enthusiasm to his ministry, and he will be a great blessing to you!

In his letter, Richard speaks of a labyrinth and how its winding path leads always to the center. In the same way, I think of the path we trace through the liturgy week by week. Our liturgy is arranged so that we walk many of the same steps every time we gather for worship, and yet it takes us somewhere. It leads always to the center, to God, and yet I think the liturgy can bring us over time to thresholds we need to cross. Along the way, the liturgy can safely hold many things for us, including the subtle shifts and sifting, the holding on and letting go, the hopes and concerns that arise during a time of transition.

At this threshold of a new season of ministry, as I prepare to say goodbye to you, I'm so very grateful for the gift of time with you; it's been a privilege and a great joy. I will keep you always in my prayers, and in my heart.



Bishop Search Process Continues

As many of you know, our diocese is in the midst of seeking a new diocesan bishop. Earlier this year, Bishop Tom Shaw called for the election of a new bishop; Bishop Shaw will retire in September when the bishop is consecrated. A Discernment Committee has been hard at work screening applications and interviewing candidates; the committee anticipates that a final slate of candidates will be released in January. A series of "walkabouts" will be held in March to give everyone an opportunity to meet the candidates. The electing convention will be held on April 5, 2014 at the cathedral. Update on the Together Now Campaign



Together Now, the collaborative capital campaign we undertook in partnership with the Diocese, continues to bear fruit. The public solicitation phase of the campaign was completed in April 2012. Now we are

within the continuation phase, as there is a five-year period through 2017 for donors to fulfill their pledge payments.

The total amount pledged at All Saints was just under \$1.4 million. If all of the pledges by All Saints parishioners are fulfilled, our parish will receive a total of approximately \$950,000 from this campaign. The remaining amount will be retained by the Diocese and most goes towards the important mission, environmental and building initiatives to which the Diocese has committed. (There is also a modest 2% charge for administering the follow-up and processing of campaign pledges.)

To date, All Saints Parish has received \$364,148 from the Together Now campaign for our local parish purposes. As planned, 10% of this has been earmarked for Mission and Outreach. Most of the remaining funds are currently being held for future use. However, approximately \$26,000 has been spent out of these funds on plans to modernize the Rectory and also to investigate whether the Town of

Brookline will permit the creation of some additional residential units within the Rectory. The Rectory renovation and its possible transformation was one of the goals identified in our Together Now campaign.

Another significant need identified in our Together Now campaign was the evident water intrusion on the Beacon Street and Dean Road sides of the Sanctuary. The Vestry is hopeful that the work necessary to address this ongoing damage will be undertaken in 2014.

Thanks to all who have been fulfilling their Together Now campaign pledges. As you can see, we are likely to be putting the funds raised to important purposes at All Saints Parish very shortly, so we are grateful for your efforts to keep current with your pledge schedule. By the end of the year we would hope that you would have contributed 40% of your pledge.

During the liturgical seasons of Advent, Christmas, & Epiphany, our children and young people will be immersed in the stories of Jesus' birth and ministry. If you do not have children in our formation programs, but want to see what we are doing, please contact Becky Taylor to arrange a visit to a classroom. During Advent (December 1, 8, 15, & 22)

- *Cherubs* will journey with the Prophets, the Holy Family, the Shepherds and the Magi on the way to Bethlehem and the mystery that is Christmas.

- *2nd – 5th Graders* will explore the Christmas story in a unit called "Be Alert, Shepherds!"

- *6th – 12th Graders* will reflect on the appointed scripture readings for Advent as they organize the parish gift drive for the residents of Crossroads Shelter and the children at B-READY.

(January 5 & 26; February 9 & 23, March 2)

- *Cherubs* will explore the sacrament of Baptism and engage with some of Jesus' parables.

- *2nd – 5th Graders* will get acquainted with Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

- *6th – 12th Graders* will reflect on the lectionary readings for the season, looking for how these connect to their daily lives.

Mission Notes from Tanzania

In early October I traveled to Tanzania on a solo mission trip – my sixth – to the Anglican Diocese of Tanga. I spent the first weekend visiting my friend Father Joel Makame at Holy Cross Parish in Magila. (Father Joel was our guest at All Saints two years ago.) I attended a wedding, read the lesson in Swahili during Sunday worship, and accompanied Joel to a soccer match between the Holy Cross team and a team from the local public secondary school. The soccer team is part of an outreach program initiated by Father Joel to bring young men in their 20's and 30's back to the church. And it's working! Several young men on the team who were lapsed churchgoers have returned, bringing friends with them. It was a great game, but despite loud support from the stands, our team went down to a close defeat, 3-2.

However, the Holy Cross team looked splendid in their new red uniforms! The uniforms, boots, and soccer balls had been blessed and dedicated on Sunday morning at Holy Cross. These items were purchased from two funding sources: a donation from my good friend Dianne Moss from St. Michael and All Angels in Dallas, Texas, and from the freewill offering at Mary Ricker's recital at All Saints in late September. Mary, a member of our choir, wanted the proceeds of her concert to benefit the Children's & Youth Ministries of our parish. After consultation with her and Becky Taylor, half the money was used here at the parish to purchase new chairs for one of our Church School classrooms, and half went to support our ministry with young people in Tanzania. What a marvelous way for our parish's music, youth, and mission ministries to collaborate!

Mission Trip to Tanzania in January 2014

Seven parishioners from All Saints will be traveling to Tanzania in early January 2014 as part of a larger mission group from the Diocese of Massachusetts. They are: Colin Johnstone, who is leading the mission team, Jim Daniell, Elinor Horner, Emily Howe, Guy Parry, Carol Piñeiro and Wendy Wheeler. They will join fellow Episcopalians/ Anglicans from 5 other parishes in our diocese as well as the Episcopal Diocese of Pennsylvania and the Diocese of Salisbury in the Church of England.

The group, 18 in total, will have a busy week in Tanga visiting projects and programs supported by All Saints and other churches in Massachusetts, Salisbury, Hereford and Ohio. Among other places, they will visit the Misufini Leprosy Care Center, Father Joel's church (Holy Cross Magila), St. Alban's parish Mgombezi, Hegongo Holy Cross School, St. Augustine's Hospital in Muheza and the newly built health center in Kizara. A highlight of the trip will be the laying of a foundation stone for the nursery school to be built next to the church of St. Francis Xavier, Kizara. This school will be named in honor of Bishop Shaw as the "Bishop M. Thomas Shaw SSJE Nursery School."

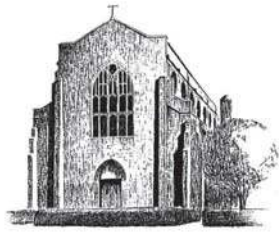
